

Healthy Homemade Granola Recipe

4 C. Old Fashioned Oats 1/2 C. shredded coconut 1/4 C. wheat germ 1/4 C. unsalted sunflower seeds 1/2-1 TSP. cinnamon 1/4 TSP nutmeg 3/4 C. honey

1/4 C. unsalted sunflower seeds Craisins, nuts, whatever variety you like Heat oven to 350 and spread coconut onto cookie sheet lined with parchment paper. Bake a few minuets until toasted. Reduce oven to 300, line 1-2 baking sheets with parchment. In large bowl toss all ingredients, you can add a little coconut oil if you like for added coconut flavor. Spread all on baking sheets and bake for appx. 20 minuets or until golden. Cool, break into pieces and enjoy!! The beauty of this recipe is you can add what ever nuts and dried fruit you like! Try it with dried blueberries too!

This service is free and no appointment is necessary. You may also register to vote at this time or make changes to your current registration. Accepted forms of ID to obtain a photo ID are a government issued document, utility bill, bank statement, lease or rental statement, property tax statement or vehicle registration.
